NATURE NOTE

Missouri's Endangered Watch List

The Wood Frog is on Missouri's endangered watch list. When the perfectly camouflaged wood frog is sitting quietly among dead oak and maple leaves, it is nearly invisible. When you happen to see one of these rare frogs on a woody outing, you have received a special gift!

What does it mean to be on the Watch List? This means the species is not currently rare or endangered, but has a restricted distribution or has experienced sufficient decline to indicate it may soon become rare or endangered. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Department of the Interior develops the federal endangered species list. State listings (like this one) are less structured and are led by the MDC's Endangered Species Coordinator with the participation of many MDC biologists and managers, as well as professionals from colleges, universities and participating organizations.



If you see a small brown frog with a dark eye mask in the woods, it is likely to be a wood frog. There are no other species with a similar appearance to the wood frog in North America. Their first evasive leap is fast and long. Close observation will often glimpse a second short dive under the leaf litter, making the frog appear to disappear.

Females are larger than males. Adult wood frogs are usually brown, tan, or rust colored, and usually have a dark eye mask.



Individual frogs are capable of varying their color. The underparts of wood frogs are pale with a yellow or green cast.

The wood frog has garnered attention by biologists over the last century because of their freeze tolerance. Similar to other north-

ern frogs that hibernate close to the surface in soil and/or leaf litter, wood frogs can tolerate the freezing of their blood and other tissues. Urea is accumulated in tissues in preparation for overwintering, and liver glycogen is converted in large quantities to glucose in response to internal ice formation. Both urea and glucose act as "cryoprotectants" to limit the amount of ice that forms and to reduce osmotic shrinkage of cells. Frogs can survive many freeze/thaw events during winter if not more than about 65% of the total body water freezes.

Car Stickers & Key Cards

We urge you to KEEP OFF all frozen lakes as thin ice conditions may exist. We DO NOT recommend any activity on lakes this time of year. Also, for your safety and the safety of your pets, take special care when walking dogs near frozen water — as they may wander onto frozen-over lakes. As well, the inclines near the water's edge could be slippery. Ext. 163.
