NATURE NOTE

Catch of the Day

If you've ever spent the day on a lake at Innsbrook with a fishing pole in hand, you know that they are full of fish of every shape and size. The most common fish in our lakes are bass, bluegill, crappie, and - Missouri's state fish - the channel catfish. Channel catfish are also known as spotted cat, blue cat, fiddler, lady cat, chucklehead cat and willow cat. They're the most numerous catfish species in North America, with an average size of between 2 and 4 pounds (the channel catfish can grow as large as 45 pounds - if you catch one that big, we'll be talking about it for years to come!). Try your hand at reeling in one of these fish, and don't forget to bring your camera!

Inspect Your Dock

Since boating season is here we'd like to encourage owners to check the electrical outlets at their private docks for safety. Any exterior receptacle should be GFCI protected. In order to test the GFCI outlet, push the "test" button firmly and then plug something into it to test if the power is off. After testing you can reset it by pushing the "reset" button firmly. If the power does not turn off when the "test" button is pushed, you should have it replaced ASAP. Please use caution when dealing with electrical outlets, especially by water. Fire District Rating May Lower Insurance

The Wright City Fire Protection District (WCFPD) recently received confirmation from the Insurance Services Office (ISO) of a reduction in the insurance rating for properties within five road miles of a WCFPD or mutual aid partner's responding fire station and within 1,000 feet of a fire hydrant or alternate water supply. Many insurance companies use the ISO rating as part of their formula for calculating insurance premiums. Innsbrook property owners located within the WCFPD are encouraged to check with their insurance companies to see if the ISO changes will affect the cost of their insurance.
