Last Call for Boat Removal!

All boats must be removed from all marinas, beaches and common areas by this upcoming **Monday, November 30**. Need help with removal? Innsbrook will move your boats for \$35 per small boat (\$20 each additional boat) and \$100 for pontoon boats. Do you want Innsbrook to store your boat for you this winter? The cost is \$100 for pontoons and \$50 for small boats. *Boats not removed from common areas by December 1 will be removed by Innsbrook with double the fee to the owner.* Ext. 163.

NATURE NOTE

The Thanksgiving Turkey

You may know that the turkey was once so common in America and so well liked that it was considered for our national emblem, along with the bald eagle.

Turkeys are large and powerful, standing three feet tall when alert. They have bare necks covered with red and blue, bumpy skin. Long legs, and broad wings and tail, make them swift runners, as well as quick flyers for short distances. Their feathers are large, mostly brown, barred with black. Body feathers reflect shades of bronze, green, gold and blue — beautiful colors that help turkeys blend into wooded areas.

Turkeys were domesticated by Native Americans and brought to Europe in the sixteenth century. Taken from Mexico by the Spanish conquistadors, turkeys later returned as domesticated birds with the English settlers. The wild turkey almost disappeared from our continent due to excessive hunting and loss of forest habitat. Today, thanks to restoration efforts, the wild turkey has been restored in many areas.
