Memorial Day: We Must Remember

Memorial Day honors our military veterans who gave the last full measure of devotion fighting for our freedom. From our War of Independence to Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan, brave men and women have answered and continue to answer the call to serve. For as Plato so unfortunately noted, "Only the dead have seen the end of war." Memorial Day grew out of Decoration Day which called on people to remember the 620,000 Civil War soldiers who died - more than the total of soldier deaths in World War I and II.

Possibly, the first Decoration Day remembrance was done in 1866 by former slaves, ministers, and the famed all-volunteer 54th Massachusetts Regiment. At the Washington Race Course and Jockey Club in Charleston, South Carolina, they honored the 260 Union soldiers who died there during imprisonment. Also in 1866, Decoration Day officially began in Waterloo, New York. Businesses closed, graves were decorated with flowers and flags, and the community hosted the event annually. In 1868, General John A. Logan organized all the individual Decoration Day remembrances into a national day of remembrance to be held on the 30th of May because that was a day when no Civil War battles were fought.

In 1971, Congress renamed Decoration Day to Memorial Day, changed the date to the last Monday of the month of May, and declared it a federal holiday. America would not be America if it were full of Thomas Paine's "summer warriors and sunshine patriots" because, as the late U.S. Senator and Navy Admiral, Jeremiah A. Denton states, "It is the soldier, not the reporter, who has given us freedom of the press. It is the soldier, not the poet, who has given us freedom of speech. It is the soldier, not the campus organizer, who has given us the freedom to demonstrate. It is the soldier, who salutes the flag, who serves beneath the flag and whose coffin is draped by the flag, who allows the protester to burn the flag."

All I can say is thank you, to the courageous American men and women willing to pay the ultimate sacrifice so "a new nation, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal...that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth."

Bluebird Trail Report

This week our bluebirds have 76 nests, containing 222 eggs, 54 chicks, and 87 more chicks have fledged.

To continue our house sparrow discussion, if you remove their nest the male will immediately begin to rebuild it. Last year, a sparrow's nest was removed eight weeks in a row from the same box. So this year, we are trying a new approach. House sparrows prefer a dark cavity for their nests, but bluebirds don't mind if some sunlight comes into the box. So we have started to put skylights into our nest boxes where sparrows are a problem. We drill a 2 1/2 inch diameter hole in the roof of the nest box and then cover the hole with clear plexiglass. So far, it's been working quite well. If you are having a sparrow problem please contact Shirley (contact information listed below) and we will install a skylight on your box.

IBK Fishing Club: Tip of the Week

Fish love cicadas. The cyclical hatch provides a smorgasbord for many species of fish. Unlike many insects, cicadas do not hatch from water. They emerge from land. Cicadas enter the lakes by falling from trees and bushes. When the locusts hit the water, it is often a race between fish, turtles, and other creatures to slurp up the bugs. Fishing during the hatch requires using baits that look like cicadas. They need to be floating baits, with brown, black, and red shades. Pitch these lures under an overhanging tree or bush (fish shorelines during the hatch). Once your lure hits the water, watch out! A fierce strike is moments away.
